

### A Glance on the History of the College

Sikh National College, one of the oldest and historical educational institutions of the region, was established in June 1938 at Lahore, with S. Niranjan Singh as its founder principal. It was the dream of the people of the time to build an ideal institute committed to National Ideas, which would mould the character of students into non-communal brotherhood. For the purpose, Principal Niranjan Singh had the backing as well as co-operation of Baba Bhola Singh, Master Kehar Singh, Giani Kartar Singh, Master Tara Singh and Bawa Harkishan Singh Ji. Sikh Educational Society (S. E. S.) was registered in Lahore with Baba Bhola Singh, as President and Master Kehar Singh, as the Secretary to manage the college affairs.

As the country edged towards partition in 1947, Sikh National College too had to pay the price. It had to abandon its functioning at Lahore in June 1947. However it was re-established at Qadian in March 1948, with Bawa Harkishan Singh Ji as its first Principal in the Post-Independence Era.

Presently, the Sikh Educational Society (Head Office, Chandigarh) is managing the college affairs, along with five other pioneer educational institutions, SGGS College, GGS College for Women, SGGS College of Pharmacy, SGGS Collegiate Public School, all at Chandigarh and Sikh National College at Banga (Nawa Shehar). Hon'ble S. Gurdev Singh Brar IAS (Retd.) and S. Kulbir Singh Chief Er. (Retd.) are respectively the President and Vice-President. Col (Retd.) Jasmer Singh Bala and S. Karandeep Singh Cheema (Advocate) are respectively the Secretary and Joint-Secretary of the Society.

### The Present State Of Affairs

The college has undergone revolutionary changes in recent years. It is situated in beautiful and historical building. The College has an enriched computerized Library, well-equipped Science laboratories, a modern fully air-conditioned Computer Lab, Seminar hall with modern facilities, Guru Nanak Dev Studies Centre, extensive playgrounds for Cricket, Football, Hockey and a standard 6-lane track, Girls Common Room and Canteen. These are the chief attraction of the college. A swimming pool, a basketball ground and a badminton court are the pride possessions of the college.

All modern facilities, like generator set, four water coolers fitted with R.O., a Xerox machine, fax, printers and scanner are the added features. The college, on its roll, has qualified, dedicated and hard working staff.

The college is affiliated to G. N. D. U., Amritsar for Degree, Diploma & PG courses. The college offers regular courses, like B A, B Com, B.Sc.(Non-Medical), BSc Computer Science, BSc Economics and B. A. in Computer Application (Vocational). Full time computer courses, such as D.C.A., B.C.A. and B.Sc. IT, at UG level and PGDCA, Diploma in Library Science and MSc IT, at PG level have also been made available for the students. Another PG course, MA (Punjabi) is also being run successfully. Having this paraphernalia, the institute is creating better opportunities for prosperous future of its students.

- B) M.A. ELIGIBILITY:- Bachelor's Degree in any faculty with 50% marks in aggregate or (Punjabi) 45% marks in the subject concerned or equivalent examination.
- C) M.Sc. (IT) ELIGIBILITY: Graduate with Computer Science/IT/Computer Applications/
  Computer Maintenance as one of the Elective Subjects with 50% marks in aggregate.

  OR
  BCA/B.Sc. (IT)/BIT or equivalent there to with atleast 50% marks in aggregate.

### Rules & Regulations For Admission

- 1. The applicants seeking admission for degree courses should have passed the higher/senior Secondary Examination (XII Std.) under the 10+2 pattern, prevalent in Punjab or its equivalent, from other Universities or Boards.
- 2. The applicants will apply to the Principal in the prescribed form, which can be obtained from the college office, against payment of Rs. 150/-
- 3. The applicants will submit the completely filled admission form, with a recent passport size photograph, required certificates and the testimonials in the college office. Students coming from universities within/outside Punjab shall bring Migration and Eligibility Certificates.
- The applicant will personally appear before the selection committee at the time of admission and will produce the relevant certificates in original.
- 5. The Students, who are found to have obtained admission by the false representation, will summarily be dismissed with forfeiture of all the fees.
- 6. A student applying for admission, at what so ever time, will have to pay the fee for the whole academic session.

- 7. The student desiring to leave, in mid-session will have to make a written request to Principal, through his/her parents/guardians. The permission will be granted, if he/she has paid the fees for the whole academic session.
- 8. Foreign students, seeking admission in this college, should possess a regular long-term student visa, issued by the respective Indian Embassy. A Temporary or Tourist Visa will not be accepted in any case. The candidates will also possess an eligibility certificate from G.N.D.U., Amritsar, which can be obtained by applying on a prescribed application form.
- 9. At the time of admission, the students will submit the original certificate of the last examination passed, the migration certificate of the concerned Board/University along with the application form. The candidates must bring at least four recent, unattested, and passport size photographs at the time of admission.
- 10. All admissions are provisional and are subject to the approval of G.N.D.U., Amritsar. The admission will be cancelled with forfeiture of all the fees, if, at any time, a student is found ineligible.
- 11. Reservation in Admission for SC/BC and PWD candidates applicable as per UGC and Pb. Govt. Rules.
- 12. The Principal reserves the right to admit or cancel the admission of a student.

Note :- Students will bring original certificates at the time of admission.

### For Procuring The Eligibility Certificate

The students, who have passed the last examination from the Punjab/Punjabi University, need not produce the Eligibility Certificate. The Intermediate students, from Bihar Intermediate Education Council, will submit the admit card, issued by the council, the transfer certificate from the school/college and other relevant documents of the basic qualification.

Foreign students are required to get the Recognition Certificate from the Association of Inter-Universities, Kotla Marg New Delhi. They can get it by submitting the student visa along with the certificates of the previous examination to G.N.D.U., Amritsar. A student, who has passed 10+2 examination with only four subjects including English, can provisionally be admitted for the degree class, provided he/she clears the fifth subject within the same group from the open school, New Delhi. Their admission shall stand cancelled, if he/she fails to clear the fifth subject within one year. In a meeting, held on 24-2-1999 (ref. to the paragraph 89), the Syndicate has passed a decision, that the student with bachelor Degree, before 1991 under old (14 years) system, will be considered eligible for admission to different courses.

Students from other states can take Punjab History and Culture Mudli Punjabi in place of Compulsory Punjabi. These rules are printed in the university calendar of 1999, Part-second page no. 4&5.

### Attendance And Leave For Absence

- 1. A student will have to attend all the classes regularly and punctually, on all working days, according to the time table. No student shall remain absent from the classes, without leave.
- 2. If, it becomes necessary for a student to be absent for a valid reason, he/she should apply forehand through his/her parents, to the Principal. If the absence is due to an unforeseen reason, the application for leave must be submitted on the first day of his/her return to the college. All the leave applications must be countersigned by parents/guardians.
- 3. If, a student fails to attend 75% of the total number of lectures, delivered in the academic session, he/she will not be allowed to appear in the annual, university exams.
- 4. Request to condone, the shortage of lectures, will not be accepted as a routine matter.
- The award of scholarship/concession depends on the maintenance of 75% of attendance, excellent academic record and good behavior. Regarding these rules, no relaxation is granted.

### Eligibility Regarding University Examination

The students will be eligible to appear in the University Examination, if they qualify following conditions.

- The students must have attended 75 % of the total lectures and practical in all the subjects before the preparatory holidays or till the end of the classes.
- 2 (A) Thirty-five percent (35%) marks in every subject are must in the house test.

OR

- (B) Either, the student should have obtained 20% marks in three elective subjects or He/she should have accomplished the total percentage in the house test.
- (C) Asecond test, with the consent of Principal, may be conducted, for the Students, who fail to get the above-mentioned qualification.
- (D) Twenty percent marks (20%) in a subject are must and the sum total of marks in different papers should be 30%.
- 3 The class work and moral behavior of students must be satisfactory.

### Change In The Faculty/subjects

Students can change their faculty or subjects within 15 days of the admission, after depositing Rs 200 and Rs 100 per subject respectively.

### Migration

A student can migrate to other college in mid-session provided:

- 1. He/She is registered with G. N. D. U., Amritsar
- 2. He / She have obtained the written consent of the Principal of the concerned college.
- 3. He/She has submitted an application form, bearing remarks from both the Principals along with the fee to the Registrar, G. N. D. U., Amritsar.

### Identity Card

- Each student of the college is required to possess an Identity Card, issued by this college, with passport size photograph affixed and his/her signature attested by the principal.
- Students are advised to keep the Identity Card (I. D. Card) with them and show it, when ever demanded by the college staff.
- 3. A Duplicate I. D. Card can be issued in case, if a student losses the original one. For this, he/she have to make a written request to principal. The student will have to deposit the prescribed fee for the purpose. The college will not be held responsible for any misuse of the Identity Card.
- 4. The Identity Card will be valid only for one academic session, from the date of issue. Senior students too, will have to obtain the fresh identity card on the commencement of the new academic year.

### Payment of Fees

Those students, who do not deposit their fees by the due date, will have to pay a fine of Rs. 10/- per day. The student, who does not deposit his/her fees even after one month of the due date, his/her name shall be struck off from the college rolls. These students can seek re-admission with the consent of the Principal, after paying, re-admission fee and late fee fines.

### Infrastructure

#### Historical Building

The College has a beautiful building with twenty three spacious class rooms and one common room for girls having necessary paraphernalia. This historical building is the pride possession of our town and we are proud to say that the building is almost hundred years of age. The building also houses the new block and newly constructed class rooms.

#### Canteen

The college has a spacious canteen with separate rooms for the teachers and students. The canteen contractor serves the hygienic food material at reasonable prices. The canteen thus helps students to become refreshed and relaxed.



#### Laboratories

There are different spacious laboratories for the Chemistry and Physics departments. Each lab has been equipped with the required apparatus to conduct the practical classes.

### Computer Lab:

There is a modern fully air conditioned computer lab, which efficiently serves the needs of M Sc IT, PGDCA, BCA, BSc IT and DCA students. The lab has 102 high tech computers with networking and high speed internet facilities. New Desktops, All in One Computers, Laptop, Projectors, LED and Printers have also been added in the existing stock.



#### Guru Hargobind Stadium

The stadium has been constructed to promote sports activities in the college campus. People of the surrounding area and sports persons practice different games during the morning and evening times. With the help of UGC grants and government schemes, the stadium has been expanded further and new rooms have constructed.

#### Salient Features of The Stadium

- 1. The stadium has standard, 400 m six lane track.
- 2. A multipurpose building has been constructed with facilities like change rooms and bathrooms.
- 3. At one corner of the track, the shooting range, a "Kabbadi" ground, volley ball ground, etc are the additional features of the stadium.
- 4. The stadium has been equipped with an underground network of water pipes and a submersible pump for supplying water.
- New rooms have been constructed.

#### Playgrounds

There are separate and spacious playgrounds for games like basketball, football, hockey, cricket, volleyball and badminton.



#### General Useful Appliances

The college owns two Auditorium and one Seminar Hall with modern audio-visual equipments, like Projector, Screen, CD player, LED TV etc. All modern facilities like Electric Generators, Refrigerator, three Water Coolers fitted with R.O., a Xerox Machine, Fax, Printer, and Scanner are there in the college.

#### Tutorial Groups

Each student is assigned a tutorial group with a faculty member (tutor) to develop his/her personality. The meeting of tutorial groups is held on the last Saturday of every month, where in, a student can seek guidance regarding studies, career opportunities and personal problems. Attendance in the tutorial meeting is mandatory for all students.

#### Student Associations and Other Societies

In addition to the excellent academic atmosphere, the students are provided opportunities to take part in co-curricular activities. The hidden artistic talents of students are detected and shaped accordingly. Following societies are functioning in the college: -

Our teachers in-charge intelligently pursue the programmes and functions of these societies, throughout the year. Thus, they shape students' personality. Students are encouraged to be members of these societies & take part in the activities enthusiastically.

#### Youth Welfare Department (Boys & Girls)

Cultural & Artistic activities are pursued by this department under the supervision & guidance of Mr. Gurdeep Singh. Every year, the department organizes *Talent Search* programme and almost hundred students are selected for different competitions. These students are further given training and their talents are refined. These students then participate in different inter college and university competitions in the categories of Music, Theater, Fine Arts, Literature, Folk Arts etc.



#### College Library

The Library offers an excellent collection of books and magazines on different subjects. There are approximately 24298 books in the college library. Twenty two daily newspapers (Punjabi, Hindi & English) and thirty-five weekly/Monthly/Annual magazines/periodicals are being subscribed by the college Library. New books are added to the existing stock as per needs and requirements of the students and the staff. Every Year, new books are added to its stock to cater and update the academic requirements.



#### Salient Features of Library

- 1 The library remains open from 8:30 to 4:30 p.m.
- 2 Every student is provided a library diary cum I.D. Card, at the time of admission. Books are issued only, on the presentation of the above-mentioned card.
- 3 The library offers the facility to borrow books from its Book Bank to poor, needy, deserving and intelligent students, for the whole academic session.
- 4 The library has been equipped with hi-tech facilities like Internet, Audio-Visual aids, Reprography and Computerized Reference Services.
- 5 In the library, separate accommodation has been managed for boys, girls, postgraduate students and the teaching staff.

#### Note:

- It is the duty of library staff, teachers and students to maintain pin-drop silence, inside the library.
- While borrowing a book, students should satisfy themselves that the book is in good condition. If, a book is in improper state, it should immediately be reported to the librarian otherwise, the students will be held responsible to pay for any damage or loss of the book in their possession.
  - All the books must be returned on or before the due date. If, the books are returned after the due date, a fine of Rs. 1 per day would be charged from the student.

### Students Welfare Department

Prof Sukhpal Kaur, as its incharge, informs and advises students regarding Fee concession, Scholarships and availability of other funds. This department also renders various services like, filling up of free ships and other scholarships for SC and ST students and detects various sources of financial help for them.

### College Council

The College Council comprises senior staff members with Principal as its chairman. It prepares and distributes academic schedule to the staff & students. It also ensures discipline in the college campus.

#### Student Council

This council is formed every year to establish communication between students and teachers. The council includes three teachers, class representatives, and the presidents of all the societies of the college.

### Assembly

An assembly of all the students is held once a month. The students are supported with the news, from the sources, like Pb. Govt. and the university. It is mandatory for all students and the teaching staff to be present in the assembly.

#### NCC

ANCC unit is working in the College under the supervision of Prof. Satwinder Singh for both Boys & Girls.



N.S.S. Wing

The college has three units (two units for boys and one unit for girls) of National Service Scheme. The N.S.S. wing supports activities like, adult education, health education and other social service programme in an adopted village. The wing also carries out projects like environmental education to the rural masses. Mrs. Sukhpal Kaur and Prof. Gurinder Singh are successfully continuing its activities.



#### Sports Activities

Since, sound brain survives in a sound body, so, Physical Education has been made an integral part of our education policy. The college owns standard 400-meter track along with separate and spacious playgrounds for games like basketball, football, hockey, cricket, volleyball and badminton. Preference in admission is given to the outstanding sports persons. The Annual Sports Day provides an opportunity to the students of our college to show their talents and skills. The College Gymnasium and Guru Hargobind Stadium are the pride possessions, to promote sports in this part of the state. The college has Cross Country, Weight lifting, Cricket, Hockey teams.



#### Medical Assistance

As Medical Officer, Dr B S Bhatia along with an expert team of physicians medically examines our students, every year. The college has first-aid facility for the students.

#### College Magazine

The college magazine "Raavi" is published, which provides a platform to students to manifest their writing capabilities. Students are encouraged to write poems, short stories and essays. Their write-ups are checked and given appropriate space in the college magazine.

#### Department of Reach-Out Activities

This department has been established to promote Reach-Out-Activities like, Adult Education and social relations. Under the guidance of the college principal, Dr Harpreet Singh works hard to eradicate the evil of illiteracy amongst rural masses through educational programs.

#### Department of Extension Activities

The Department has been created to motivate students to serve the society. Prof. Gurinder Singh, as its sole heritage, is pursuing the activities whole-heartedly since the academic session 2002-2003.

### Career Guidance and Information

This department functions under the guidance of Prof. Sukhpal Kaur. Students are informed about Various Courses, Job Opportunities & other Career related matters.

#### Placement Cell

The Placement Cell has been created in the college with Prof Gurdeep Singh as the In-charge. The opportunities for the employment of our student are sought after. Students are sent to participate in the Job fairs at different places. Awareness lectures are organized every year to update the college students for various job opportunities.

#### Grievances Redressal Cell

The cell has been created to find & redress the grievances of students and employees. If some unpleasant incident happens, Prof. Sukhpal Kaur, as its sole heritage, comes forward with suggestions and remedies.

#### Institution Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC)

The IQAC is functional in the college to ensure quality education and infrastructure for the students. The IQAC shares the feedback of the students, alumni, stakeholders etc to ensure improvement and development in the college campus. The suggestions and recommendations of the IQAC are implemented in the letter and spirit so that the college activities could be run successfully.

#### NAAC

This College was accredited for the first time by the NAAC in 2004. In the academic session 2014-2015 the college was re-accredited with NAAC. A Team of three experts arrived in the college for three days, the team stayed to inspect and observe the infrastructure and education, being provided by the College and awarded B grade to the college. With re-accreditation from NAAC, the college is now amongst the leading educational institutions of the region. The College is ready to serve the people of the area with qualitative progressive education.

#### Guru Nanak Dev Studies Center

It needs a great attention to develop religiousness amongst students because religious education shows and guides them right path in life. The topics, which create love and harmony, are selected and explained to the students. Guru Nanak Dev Studies center is functioning at present under the supervision of Dr. Harpreet Singh Hundal. The center has been established under the UGC scheme - Epoch Making Social Thinkers of India - during the 12<sup>th</sup> plan. The center is equipped with computers, library, printer, projector, screen, audio system. Teachers and students can take the help of the centre to enhance their knowledge. The Center also shoulders responsibility to hold national seminars, extension activities, workshops, Tours, Inaugural Day function and 'Ardas Divas' (Prayer Day).



### Scholarships and Concession

The college is committed to identify all the financial resources to provide scholarships, free ships and other concessions to the deserving, poor, needy and intelligent students. The fee concession and other scholarships are offered through the funds received from different trusts like Late (Col.) Ishar Singh Bajwa Memorial Trust, Late Bawa Harkishan Singh Principal Memorial Trust, Bal Family Educational Trust, The Government of Punjab and the Government of India. A cash prize of Rs. 5000- is given to each student getting merit position in GNDU Examination. All scholarship are sanctioned to the students, qualifying 75% attendance and other requirements. The above-mentioned financial supports are liable to be withdrawn due to poor attendance and other disciplinary reasons.

#### General Code of Conduct

- 1. Students are advised, not to indulge in the activities, which blemish them and the institution.
- Students should always show respect to the teaching staff.
- 3. Students should stand up, as, when the teacher enters the class.
- Students should not leave the classroom, without the permission of the teacher.
- 5. Students should cultivate the habit of reading notices, pasted on various notice boards of the college.

  Ignorance of any notice will not be accepted as an excuse for failing to comply with the information.
- 6. The consumption of intoxicating materials is strictly prohibited in the college premises.
- 7. Students should maintain silence while moving from one class to another. Loitering in groups and talking loudly in the corridors, staircases and other passages or anywhere within the college campus is prohibited. If found doing so, the students will be fined or suspended or terminated from the college rolls.
- 8. The students, in their free periods, are expected to visit library and engage themselves silently in study or other fruitful activities.
- 9. Bicycles, two-wheelers, cars etc. must be parked only in the stands meant for the purpose.
- Students, indulging in immoral activities like writing objectionable/obscene words on the blackboards, furniture and walls of the college building, will be punished severely.
- 11. Eve teasing, ragging, damaging the college property and accompanying strangers/outsiders, in the campus, will strictly be dealt with by imposing heavy fines or striking the name off, from the college rolls.
- 12. Students are advised to keep the issued ID-Cards with them and show it, whenever demanded by the college staff.
- 13. No student will take part in any political activity. If found doing so, the student will summarily be suspended or dismissed from the college rolls.
- 14. Students are advised to meet the principal at the prescribed hours only.
- 15. All rights are reserved with the Principal to impose fine, withhold certificate, suspend or expel a student and not to give Character Certificate to any student.
- 16. The students are advised to switch off their mobile/cell phones in the college corridors, classrooms and library. Otherwise they shall be imposed heavy fines.
- 17. The students contravening, the above mentioned codes of conduct will summarily be suspended or terminated from the college rolls.

#### Compulsory Notes

- Students should go through the rules and regulations attentively. Ignorance of rules in the form of
  pretenses will not be accepted.
- The prospectus is not a legal document and the Principal holds every right to make alternations in these rules.
- The Principal reserves the right to admission. The admission to a student can be refused without assigning any reason.
- The students must read the statements printed on the back of the Admission Form. It is compulsory
  to obey the statements in the latter and spirit.

#### Rules Regarding the use of Cell Phones

Student are instructed not to use cell phones in the college premises. However in case of emergency, students can use their mobile phones in the college canteen and play grounds. If any student found using cell phones in the places other than stated above, shall be fined heavily and his phone shall be ceased.
